The Delaware County Office of the Medical Examiner is seeking approximately \$1.19 million in federal funding through the U.S. Department of Justice's COSSUP program to enhance overdose prevention efforts. The grant will fund key personnel, expand our existing data and dashboard capabilities, and establish a partnership with an academic partner to analyze overdose trends and measure outcomes. The initiative will integrate data from the OME, EMS, and partner agencies to improve real-time decision-making and a coordinated response across public safety, DCHD, and other public health systems. This is a three-year project designed to strengthen our ability to identify emerging drug threats and reduce overdose fatalities in Delaware County while also developing a model that can be shared statewide.
