The Counter-Unmanned Aircraft Systems (C-UAS) Grant will enhance Delaware County's ability to detect, monitor, and respond to unauthorized drone activity in support of public safety, critical infrastructure protection, and planned special events. Through this grant, Delaware County will receive Axon Dedrone RF-350 and RF-560 drone detection sensors, portable deployment kits with tripods, software licensing, training, installation and five years of maintenance and technical support. The system provides drone detection and situational awareness capabilities and can be deployed at fixed locations or as portable assets throughout the County as operational needs require.

The amount of \$1,411,350 is the total for the equipment we are purchasing with the Grant.
